What is Uganda's greatest need?

What is Uganda's greatest need? This is the final question I posed to each of the 15 interviewees that I had the opportunity to sit with on my recent visit to our TBI campus in Kapchorwa, Uganda. I was hoping to gather stories from students, faculty, and staff about the varied life experiences that had brought them to Trinity Biblical Institute. I hoped to hear how God had worked in them by his Spirit, but I was not asking for canned responses. I wanted a full picture of how God had shaped them to bring them to this moment, through good times and bad. The final question I posed was intended just to wrap up the conversation, to get a sense of how TBI fits into a broader picture.

Of course, these are seminary students, faculty, and staff. I shouldn't be surprised if their answers were gospel-centered. What I did not expect is how consistently each interviewee tied the work of TBI to solving Uganda's, and even the world's, greatest problems. TBI Principal Fred Kabenge summarized it in this way:

"Uganda's greatest need is discipleship. The church comprises of members who are scattered in different professional backgrounds. People are learned, they are doing business, they are working in offices, but there is need for transformation. So when TBI prepares men for the gospel ministry, and they are well prepared, they are qualified. They can preach good sound doctrine. They can disseminate the gospel and challenge people to embrace Christ. The corruption which we have in Uganda, the immorality that seems to be running across different sectors of people's lives can be addressed from the pulpits."

We often hear about how "the gospel changes everything," but we rarely apply this beyond our singular lives. When we do think about the greatest needs in our culture, we tend to think merely along social and political lines. We might bemoan immorality in our culture, and in the world at large, but we think that a healthy dose of force-fed morality is what will solve our problems. It's not the case today, and has never been the case. Real transformation takes place from the inside out. The work of TCWM and TBI is to train leaders who will spark that transformation in East Africa, and hopefully, around the world. Your partnership with us is an integral part of that transformation.
